### **Current situation**

In Argentina, according to the poverty index in 2018, reported by the National Institute of Statistics (Indec), 27,3% of the population lived below the poverty line. As a result of the pandemic crisis, in 2020 the index has already climbed to 42%. Among children under 14, the figure reaches 57,7 %.

20 social organizations in Argentina and Bolivia will be trained to strengthen their professional capacities in terms of sustainability with a special focus on the creation and management of sustainable businesses.

Through these entrepreneurship trainings, 10 organizations will develop micro-enterprise concepts, offering various services for society. The aim of the project is to move from a purely social approach of an organization to a socioeconomic activity.

50 families (300 people) will be able to improve their financial situation through working in the micro-enterprises.

800 people will be able to benefit from the services offered by the micro-enterprises.
